	WORKSHOP A. Sound Financial Management	
	The workshop will focus on key aspects of financing transnational mobility measures under the ESF, taking into consideration specific questions as how to deal with costs incurred by transnational partner organisations and participant costs in the host country. Based on examples it will show how eligibility questions in transnational mobility measures can be handled. The workshop will particularly look into O Type of costs arising in the context of transnational mobility measures,	
	Use of simplified cost options,Control and audit obligations.	
	WORKSHOP B. Roles and responsibilities of transnational partners	
	A core element of transnational mobility measures under this call is the work-related learning experience abroad for participants. This creates high demands on the transnational partnership and requires special arrangements to be agreed between sending and hosting organisation. Thus the workshop will look into key aspects for a successful preparation and implementation of the stay abroad.	
	 Partnership agreement at the beginning of the project, including roles and responsibilities of partners, Organisation of and support during the stay abroad, Assessment of skills and competences gained by participants during their stay abroad.

	After the stay abroad, a well structured follow-up phase is essential to help participants to reflect on knowledge, skills and attitudes acquired, and to enable them to capitalise on these new competences when applying for further education, training or employment.
